Midkota Public School seeks a highly qualified part-time superintendent who is certified in the state or is eligible to become certified. The position starts on July 1, 2018.

The North Dakota School Boards Association (NDSBA) has been engaged to assist the school board with this search by identifying and screening applicants.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

To be considered for this position, an applicant's file must be completed and received in the North Dakota School Boards Association (NDSBA) office by May 21, 2018, and must contain:

1. Cover letter
2. Completed application form supplied by NDSBA
3. Resume
4. Certification of teaching and superintendent credential
5. Official transcripts (copies are acceptable) indicating a bachelor's, master's, doctorate degree; do not include transcripts for other coursework
6. Two current letters of recommendation
7. Applicants claiming Veterans' Preference must be a North Dakota resident, a wartime veteran, and include form DD-214

ABOUT THE COMMUNITY

The Midkota Public School District serves the communities of Binford, Glenfield, Grace City, McHenry, and Sutton. Our elementary school is located in Binford, while our junior high and high school are in Glenfield; respectively approximately 70 and 50 miles north of Jamestown, ND.

Our district was formed as a result of declining enrollment, projected reductions in staff, programs and services, and cost/ineffectiveness in program/service delivery and facility usage in the early 1990s in the Binford, Glenfield-Sutton-McHenry and Grace City schools. The onset of the combined Midkota Consortium was the 1991-92 school year, operating an elementary school in Binford and Grace City, junior high in McHenry, and senior high in Glenfield. The following year, the schools in Grace City and McHenry were closed. This arrangement remains today.

The district's geographic area is approximately 600 square miles. The Midkota Public School Board is comprised of seven members, two members representing each of the Consortium's member districts and one member at-large.

As you can see, the Midkota Public School District has afforded our students possibilities, programs/services, and extracurricular opportunities that didn't seem possible with our individual school districts back in the early 90s.

Today our K-12 enrollment is 171, after a decline to 119 in 2008. We are excited to be embarking on a \$3.7M building project that includes five classrooms as well as administrative offices. This is an exciting time for the Midkota Public School District.
